

BVRC Stockland Lovell Camp 2017



BVRC Residential Camp at Stockland Lovell, Somerset 24th April – 27th April 2017

The residential camp has been booked at Stockland Lovell. Arrival will be on Monday 24th April 12-1pm and departure after lunch on Thursday 27th April. Accommodation consists of furnished heated portacabins of various sizes, containing 2-6 bunk beds, divans, mirror, chairs and hooks for clothing.

Residents will need to take their own bedding including pillows. Shower block, loos, dining room and lounge are available on the premises.

Full catering will be provided and includes English breakfast, cold lunch, afternoon cakes and 2 course evening meal.

Stabling will be in an American style barn with hay and shavings included. Hard food will not be supplied, so we will need to take our own.

All horse must have a current flu vaccination certificate, which will be checked on arrival.

PLEASE READ THE VACCINATION RULES BELOW AND CHECK THAT YOUR HORSE'S CERTIFICATE COMPLIES IN EVERY RESPECT.

The facilities at Stockland Lovell include

- an extensive cross country course with in excess of 100 fences from 1'6" to 3'9",
- two all weather arenas (one for flatwork and one with show jumps),
- marked routes for hacking around the farm
- saddlery shop.

The plan is to have six riding sessions, one on Monday afternoon, 2 each on Tuesday and Wednesday and one on Thursday morning.

Please indicate on the booking form the type (hacking, flatwork, gridwork, show jumping or cross country) and how many sessions of riding you would like to do (not more than 2 of each jumping type, maximum of 6 sessions). We can't promise, but we will do our best to satisfy your choice.

Stockland Lovell have increased their prices significantly in 2017, but as there may be some disruption due to ongoing building work, they have agreed to keep prices the same as last year.

Costs, based on attendance by 20-24 people, are made up as follows:

accommodation, stabling (including shavings & hay/haylage), hire of arenas & cross country course	£41/per day
catering (breakfast, lunch & evening meal)	£27/per day
instructors	£101

Hence the cost this year will be £305 of which a £100 deposit shall be paid on return of the attached application form (no later than 17th March) and the remainder (£205) will be payable on or before 1st April. A second horse may be brought at a cost of £100.

Payment can be made by cheque or Bank Transfer to Sort Code: 20-02-25, Account No.: 40404357, Account Name: Bourne Valley Riding Club. Please quote your name if paying by this method.

Apart from under exceptional circumstances, payment will only be refunded if your allocated space can be filled.

Our allocation is for 40-45 people / horses. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis.

FLU VAC RULES

BRC equine influenza rules are based on the British Horseracing Authority Rules (BHA formerly The Jockey Club Rules).

Equine Influenza - Valid Certificates – Vaccination procedures

Each horse must have a valid vaccination certificate, which undeniably relates to that horse, completed, **signed and stamped** on each relevant line by a veterinary surgeon, who is not the owner of the animal.

It must state that the horse has received the appropriate course of injections against Equine Influenza as follows:

Primary Vaccination: Two injections, the 2nd between 21 days and 92 days after the 1st.

First Booster: An injection between 150 days and 215 days after 2nd primary injection.

Annual Booster An injection not more than 1 year after the preceding injection.

Only the first two injections need to have been given for the horse to compete.

None of the vaccinations may be given within the **preceding 7 days**, including the day of the competition or entry into competition stables.

Annual Boosters may be given on the same date each year, but this is not recommended.

Note: Where Passports are used as the flu' vaccination record, the horse description must be verified by a vet or authorised member of a breed society.

If the passport does not contain the full vaccination history then, to comply with rule above, the flu vaccination certificate must also accompany the pony/horse.

It is worth remembering

There is now a legal requirement for a valid passport to accompany the horse when travelling.
