BVRC club year started on  $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$  November, so it is time for annual subscriptions renewal.

Rates have increased slightly from last year's level and are £32, for Riding Members, but remain at £12 for Non Riding Members.

## This is your last chance to claim a £7 discount on a subscription for riding members, a bargain at £25. The offer expires on 31<sup>st</sup> December 2015.

The reduced rate of £25 will apply for second and subsequent members of the same household.

No discount is applicable for non-riding members, as their rate has not increased for many years.

You will need to renew your subscription if you wish to take advantage of the reduced cap when hunting with the RA Hunt.

Please fill and return the membership renewal form, sent out earlier or on BVRC website www.bvrc.co.uk, to Debs Scothern (address on form).

Subscriptions may be paid by cash or cheque (made payable to Bourne Valley Riding Club) or using PayPal via the website www.bvrc.co.uk. Payment by PayPal will incur a small surcharge to cover administration costs.

#### **BRC Insurance**

As a Riding Club affiliated to the British Horse Society, BVRC carries a certain level of insurance cover. It has become apparent that clarification is needed about the insurance cover of individual club members. The policy offers third party personal liability insurance. Members will be insured whilst taking part in activities (riding or helping) organised by BVRC, another BHS affiliated Riding Club or British Riding Clubs office at Stoneleigh. Travel to and from activities is EXCLUDED. Members are NOT INSURED outside RC activities, e.g. hacking out independently. Further insurance details may be obtained from Helen or calling South Essex Insurance Brokers (SEIB) tel: 0845 450 0634.

## Changes to Hat Standards (BS EN 1384 / EN 1384) from 1st January 2016. Rule will apply at all BVRC ridden events.

Due to a change by the European Commission regarding EN1384 and BSEN1384 no longer being an accepted standard, all hats which only meet the standard EN1384 or BSEN1384, and do not comply with another standard from the list below, WILL NOT be accepted and therefore will not be permitted for any BRC events. Hats which bear EN1384 or BSEN1384 along with another standard from the list below, will be permissible. BSEN1384 & PAS015 (1998 or 2011) along with the Kitemark, would be acceptable, but not BSEN1384 on its own.

IMPORTANT CHANGE FOR THE CROSS COUNTRY PHASE: Only a "Jockey Skull" complying standards below may be worn for any XC phase. This must not have a peak, any peak type extensions or noticeable protuberances above the eyes or to the front and should have an even round or elliptical shape with a smooth or slightly abrasive surface. A removable hat cover with a light flexible peak may be used.

HEAD CAMS are strictly prohibited at any BRC affiliated competition, including use on the head, chest, bridle or anywhere on horse or rider. Permissible hats standards are:

British PAS 015:1998 or 2011 European VG1 01.040 (2014-12) **American** ASTM F1163:(2004a or 04a)

} BSI Kitemarked Must have SEI mark

} Must have

SNELL E2001

Must have Official SNELL label and number

Australian & New Zealand AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards) Must have SAI Global mark

#### **BVRC Rule Reminder**

The club doesn't have too many rules, but just as a general reminder to keep everyone on the straight and narrow, here are details of the ones that seem to cause most problems.

BVRC membership is open to people 17 years old or older (with no upper age limit). 16 year olds may compete in competitions and attend any riding event as a member's guest, (with permission of the organiser) but BVRC does not allow under 16's to ride at their events. They do, however, welcome guests of any age at the socials.

Please be aware before you turn up that you bring the right hat with you to every single riding event & competition that we run.

Body protectors (Level 3 - Purple Label year 2000 or 2009) shall be worn for any event involving cross-country jumping and are strongly recommended for show jumping. An Airbag style protector, if used, must be worn over a permitted, level 3, body protector. Riders wearing Exo Body Cage protectors must inform the organiser before commencing any cross country.

Medical armbands are mandatory at BRC & BVRC Horse Trials, Hunter Trials and FoTH competitions and MUST BE WORN ON THE RIDER'S ARM.

Jewellery including body piercing components and therapeutic medical devices (wristbands) must be removed. If removal is not possible, items must be covered up by clothing or gloves. This will be done at the rider's own risk.

Suede chaps and half chaps may be worn but must be of identical colour to the boots and have no decoration of any sort. Black or brown polished leather gaiters with matching boots are permitted, too.

Long hair should be worn in a net or secured in such way as not to hang below the collar.

Otherwise there is no particular dress code, it is sufficient just to be "clean and tidy". Correct footwear (no Muckers) is a good idea.

### **British Riding Clubs Rule Book**

British Riding Clubs' Competitions Official Rules book is now available to view online on the BHS / Riding Clubs website. The updated version for 2016 will be available shortly.

All BVRC competitions are run under BRC Rules. Members may wish to familiarise themselves with rules /eligibility and with dress / tack rules. # BRC Area 17 Novice & Intermediate Winter Show Jumping Qualifier at Crofton EC, Stubbington, Hants on

**Sunday 21<sup>st</sup> February 2016,** (Team application forms will be available shortly)

Both teams of four riders compete over two rounds, with jumps for the Novice 80cm (2'6") in the first and 85cm (2'9") in the second round and for the Intermediate jumps at 90cm (3') in the first and 95cm (3'2") The team total is made up from the best three scores in each round. The winning teams go forward to National Championships, the Novices at Keysoe College EC, Bedfordshire on 9<sup>th</sup>/10th April and the Intermediate at Bury Farm, Slapton, Bucks on 30<sup>th</sup> April/1<sup>st</sup> May.

# BVRC Residential Camp at Stockland Lovell, Somerset 25<sup>th</sup> April –28<sup>th</sup> April 2016

The residential camp has been booked at Stockland Lovell. Arrival will be on Monday 25<sup>h</sup> April between 12-1pm and departure after lunch on Thursday 28<sup>th</sup> April.

Accommodation consists of furnished heated portacabins of various sizes, containing 2-6 bunk beds, divans, mirror, chairs and hooks for clothing. Residents will need to take their own bedding including pillows. Shower block, loos, dining room and lounge are available on the premises.

Full catering will be provided and includes English breakfast, cold lunch, afternoon cakes and 2 course evening meal.

Stabling will be in an American style barn with hay and straw included. Hard food will not be supplied, so we will need to take our own.

The facilities at Stockland Lovell include

an extensive cross country course with in excess of 100 fences from 1'6" to 3'9", two all weather arenas (one for flatwork and one with show jumps), marked routes for hacking around the farm

The plan is to have six riding sessions, Monday afternoon, 2 each on Tuesday and Wednesday and one on Thursday morning. All horse must have a current flu vaccination certificate, which will be checked on arrival.



# This autumn BVRC offered a 'Body - Mind - Analysis' approach to our riding.

'Body' through Gina Hemmings' Equipilates approach to improving our own suppleness and flexibility, in support of our horse;

'Mind' through Liz Morrison's talk (& next year's workshops) to understand our thought patterns and take responsibility for what we bring to our riding; and

'Analysis' through the Centaur Biomechanics clinic to see our posture and alignment on the horse on video, with the opportunity to address issues straight away. Below is a summary of my experience of all three offerings, which will hopefully motivate you to try at least one of these in 2016 for the benefit of you and your horse.

## **Equipilates course - Gina Hemmings**

Marion Watt, Susie Pool, Sally Shepherd and I attended this 6 week course, together with 2 friends from Wessex Classical Riding Group who ensured the course actually ran.

The initial focus of the first couple of session was 'Normalising before strengthening' - there is no point strengthening our bodies if they are not aligned correctly. This included anti-spasm exercises for hip flexors, stretching quadratus lumborum in the lower back, exercises with the massage balls, opening the shoulders & lengthening our sides laterally (as we want our horses to do in 'correct bend').

Strengthening the Core - previously this has been taught to me in terms of focusing abdominal muscles back towards the spine, something I always found impeded my breathing. Gina taught this more 3-dimensionally to engage the diaphragmatic girdle and I have found this very natural to use throughout the day, as well as in riding. This approach engages the whole body, rather than just the lower back.

In the last 3 sessions Gina gave us various breathing exercises and broke down the half-halt through neck, shoulders, hands as we took turns being horse and rider with thera-bands. She also gave us more traditional Pilates exercises to strengthen our core, increasing suppleness on the mat, core strength on the gym ball and culminating with balancing on the roller in jumping position & standing position.

As a consequence of attending Gina's course I feel more aware of my seatbones, back, elbows & shoulders when riding, feel more balanced & deeper in the saddle, with a more consistent contact. My ponies feel more attentive and I have absorbed the occasional small spook much more easily.

Many thanks to Susie for coordinating this course with Gina. We have all signed up for another 5 week course starting early January to build further on what we have learned.

# Mind-Body-Body-Mind - Liz Morrison

A very engaging, interactive evening with a highly observant, insightful coach. It was noted how many non-club members were present - clearly the talk resonated with many people!

Liz started off asking us to think about our best experiences with horses and our worst, capturing key words used to describe these around the room, to connect us with what was important to us in our relationship with our horses.

With the help of a Horse glove puppet Liz reminded us of equine priorities - safety, food, reproduction - and the importance of the ears.....I'm sure, in our riding since, those who attended the talk have all been watching whether we have an ear back on us most of the time, and if not, doing something to get it!!

In discussing various scenarios put forward by the attendees, notably - "Spook - Panic - Fall off" - Liz used her vocalising Sheep to highlight any negative words or beliefs in what was being said - the 'Baa's" sounded quite frequently at one point! The Sheep highlighted where we create negative beliefs about future events & competitions and how our brains get to work to fulfill this instruction. Better to always have positive images and instructions going into our brain for it to work on, rather than negative ones.....

This requires awareness and practice to **take responsibility** for what thoughts run through our head, which then translate into our riding. Fortunately Liz will be running Dismounted Rider workshops in 2016 to help support us in this. I will be coordinating these for BVRC on behalf of Liz - more details in the New Year.

# Centaur Biomechanics with Russell McGuire - Castle Farm, 12th December

Having not ridden much over the preceding weeks (Equipilates taking one of my riding slots!!), and grabbing Teddy out of the field in the dark, it was good to know we were merely travelling to a useful, insightful session, regardless of the amount of mud on my hairy pony, rather than a dressage test!! It also meant Russell was seeing us 'not at our best', which was a good start point.

Russell watched me ride around on both reins, then I put the jacket on with lines on the back and arms to show vertical/horizontal alignment and Teddy had two spots put on his pelvis. Russell then videoed us travelling down the centre line on both reins, and circling in trot.

Watching the replay it was clear to see where I had a slight rotation to the right and how this may translate into Teddy's stiffness on the left rein (as well as him being naturally right-hoofed). Nice to be told I looked evenly balanced in my seat. A short lesson trotting around Russell on the left rein to get my left shoulder back, left leg active, right hip forward and feel the change in Teddy as a result. Then figure eights to change the bend frequently. I could feel Teddy stretching through his right side more and he was able to soften at times.

Being able to see Teddy and me on video, have a short lesson and then feel the improved Teddy/watch the second video was hugely valuable. For the price of 2-3 lessons, the 45 minutes with Russell gave me much to work on through this winter, both in a school and out hacking, to set us up for more balance and suppleness in our riding together.
