Reports

British Riding Club Novice Winter Championships, Keysoe 9th April 2016, Dressage and Show Jumping - Sandra Groves

What do golf balls and peas have to do with horses? All will be revealed.....

Bourne Valley Dressage and Show Jumping teams qualified for the Novice Winter Championships at Keysoe. A new venue for the Championships, it was one none of us had been to before. And it is a number of years since we qualified for the show jumping, having been successful for the past few in the dressage including having Individual National Winter Dressage Champions for the past two years.

Show jumping isn't my favourite discipline but at camp a couple of years ago Timmy and I progressed and I had more confidence. However, only jumping a couple of times a year isn't great practice and this was evident at the Novice Indoor Show Jumping qualifier. I didn't enjoy the experience one bit and came out after the second round vowing never to jump again! Timmy was chipping in a short stride and making the jump feel awful. Our team finished second and we thought only the first placed team qualified. A week later we'd been invited to the championships. Gulp! I decided I'd go for it, make a plan and practice, practice, practice. 6 weeks to go.

Prior to the qualifier I'd started the Sports Psychology sessions with Liz Morrison in an attempt to try and gain some self belief and help with my nerves. At the final session (shortly after we found out we were off to Keysoe) Liz worked with me through the process of thinking how to get from the phrase 'I'm not very good at show jumping' to 'I'm brilliant at show jumping'. One of the main stumbling points for me is not getting a good show jumping canter. Liz also confirmed that a plan was needed.

So the plan was to fit in as many lessons as I could, to stick with one instructor and do some competitions. Fen Hargreaves at Norton Livery was recommended and Susie and Lindsay offered transport. The lessons, six in all, were geared brilliantly and in the first one, we managed to achieve a great canter. With that canter in my head, we did the club show jumping at Tidworth and I was brimming with confidence and Timmy loved it. A few more lessons, then we took part in the Area Combined Training qualifier, Timmy was a bit looky and we had a refusal! Not great for the team result but a lesson learnt for me. We wanted to try and make things as scary as possible filler and jump wise to get Timmy used to things and me mentally sound, as at championship we knew the fences would be up to height and spread. There would also be a treble in the course – something new for us. In my last lesson with Fen in the week of the champs, she upped the anti with the jumps and I did have a crisis of confidence. However, we finished on a good note. Susie had been transporting Timmy and bringing her own horse Dubai along too. In my last lesson, she and Fen wore headsets so Susie could listen exactly to what Fen was saying to me and therefore help me warm up at Keysoe. I felt as prepared as I could be.

As well as the show jumping team qualification, the dressage team also qualified and sadly Alison Coleman and Wilba were unable to go and the place was offered to me. We were going to have a busy day! Lynn Mead was in the dressage team too and gave us a lift to Keysoe. We travelled the day before as the show jumping was going to start really early and we'd need to walk the course the night before. My anxiety levels were getting high. At area, the heights for the two rounds were 80cm and 85cm. I'd checked the championship heights in the rule book which stated 80cm maximum in the first round and the second round may go up at the judge's discretion. However, on walking the first round it looked like several of the jumps were over 80cm and the spreads looked huge to me too! There were 12 fences including a double and a treble so the

longest course we've done. I asked Lynn there and then if we could go home! We discussed how I'd ride the course and I calmed down enough to get some sleep that night.

My dressage was at 8.37am and show jumping at 10.54am and 3.44pm. Well spread out but giving loads of worry time. There was a helpful arena walk for the dressage at 7.30am which was interesting as I was only allowed to walk on the right rein around my arena! I thought Timmy tried hard in the dressage and the judge commented that we presented the test well. We scored 65.8%, fair for what we did, however, at championship the standard is very high so we weren't challenging the leaders.

I only plait on special occasions. Being a cob, Timmy's mane is very thick in the middle and was almost non existent three quarters down having been rubbed by his rug. Susie was impressed I had actually plaited at all but I exclaimed that they were the size of golf balls and peas! This made us both roar with laughter and that was an expression we used during the day to make me laugh, smile, relax and worry less. The other was that we also had royalty in our team – Frances Hall. She was chatting to someone at a recent event saying she had a Highland Pony. 'Oh, like the Queen' the other person said. With that, Frances' Corgi walked round from the back of her car!!

The show jumping course wasn't producing many clears and Frances and Snoopy had two down and Michelle Raymond one. I was next in the team to go and Susie did a brilliant job warming me up, telling me what to do and giving me confidence (golf balls, peas and royalty). My other instruction from Lindsay was to 'go in there like you mean business'! This we did and to my delight, Timmy didn't make anything of the fences and didn't really look at the fillers but I was determined and positive. Unfortunately, we had the first part of the double down but I was over the moon. Fay Chivers rode last in the team and although her mare was a bit green, she rode with more determination than me to have just one fence down. Initially she wasn't sure if her horse would go near the gallery and as she came through the finish towards it, everyone clapped and the mare stopped dead but at least she'd gone through the timing equipment!

I had ages between my two show jumping rounds so Timmy had some lunch and a lie down (literally - getting shavings in his plaits). Lynn rode her dressage test and although Sunny coped well with the arena (he's a little spooky), there was some tension at times and she scored plus 64%. Considering it was his first time staying away Lynn was really pleased with how he coped. Fen Hargreaves and Ruth Allen were also in the dressage team. There was some doubt earlier in the week if Fen's horse would make it to the event. Watching Fen's test there didn't seem to be much wrong, however, she wasn't the judge's favourite that day. It was terribly disappointing for her as she won her arena at the qualifier. Ruth's horse Flo was another that didn't catch the judge's eye. So sadly our dressage team was well down the order.

The jumps went up for the second round and bearing in mind that some were already over height some were now looking closer to 90cm – higher in a course than we've jumped before. Strangely, the course was the same except the first two fences were now the last two. Odd as I'd fully expected a vastly different track. I was able to watch to watch Frances and Snoopy who flew round but rolled three poles. I didn't see her round but Michelle sadly had a sat nav error and missed a fence.

Fen and Susie warmed me up for this round and with encouragement again (golf balls and peas), we went in like we meant it and rode a smooth positive round. There were two sets of planks and sadly we had them both down but overall it felt like a great round. There were smiles all round, big hugs and pats and even a couple of tears from Fen which was so touching.

Fay rode her second round with the same determination and professionalism and was so unlucky to roll a pole in the middle of the treble. Our team finished on 40 faults so although we were well out of contention it was a great experience. Looking at the results, the team in first place had 4 faults and the tenth placed team had 16 faults. Michelle and Fay were called into the team to replace Fiona Scott and Karen Duggleby who couldn't make it to the championships. Thank you to them for stepping in. It seems that Riding Clubs don't really know the definition of 'maximum' – a fact that was pointed out on the day, sadly to no avail.

When top riders do well they say they have a great team behind them and that isn't really any different at our level. Without support from my 'team' I wouldn't have made it to these show jumping championships. Lindsay is always there as a friend, trainer, mentor, my eyes on the ground and ferries us all over the place. Susie has been great taking me to lessons and thinking about how best she can help. Fen was encouraging, thought about what we needed to do in our lessons and had a plan and Lynn was so helpful taking us and being there to talk to after walking the first course.

Kings Troop horse exercise also caused some mayhem with their escapees. It made the dressage a bit exciting. Good job it only happens every 300 years!

Otherwise, we had a lovely day, everything ticked along nicely. I love it when a plan comes together.
