Last hosted here in 2007 Great Britain came away with team gold and our squad members have gone on to achieve great results – four were seen riding at Badminton this year! Last year's CCI3* winner, and World No.1, William Fox-Pitt (Neuf Des Coeurs), has gone on to finish 4th in Kentucky CCI4* last month and Nicola Wilson (Opposition Buzz) won the CIC3* before going to the World Equestrian Games bringing home team gold.

If this isn't enough horse for you, spectators can choose further still with

British Showjumping classes, the Highland Pony show, Championship Hunter Show, the National Pony Society Scotland Finals, Ex Racehorse Championships, CHAPS, Veterans and much more!

Winter Show Jumping – Cholderton EC, 27 March 2011

Thank you SO much to all the volunteers for all their help and excellent support in making the day such a great success. I had many appreciative comments and grateful thanks from various competitors and these were as a result of the hard work and friendliness of the officials; and the sunshine helped too! I was particularly thankful to those who stepped up to the mark without me, when I was called away for an hour or so to deal with an issue over the gate pillar at the front entrance.

The efforts of Helen Nash-Steer taking all the entries despite working some night shifts and not being available on the day,

the 5 volunteers setting up on the Saturday and 10 others on the day, enabled 37 competitors to compete in about 60 rounds (plus numerous Clear Rounds). A few days beforehand entries were still not covering our costs by over £100 but based on last year's late entries, I decided to take the risk and continue with the event. Thankfully we had sufficient late entries that we were able to cover the costs with about £70 to spare - this will be useful to offset most of the loss accrued at the Winter Dressage which suffered from very low entries. All in all it was a very good day and everyone seemed to enjoy and appreciate the change of venue.
