### AGM Report

#### Chairman's Report

I approached last year's AGM feeling rather despondent and not really sure about being re-elected for another 2 year term of office. Several key committee members were standing down after doing Stirling work. Volunteers to replace them were conspicuous by their absence. Helpers at our events had been hard to find culminating in an almost crisis situation at our Hunter Trial. Inadequate numbers of Fence Judges threatened the cancellation of the event, and at the very least meant reducing the number of fences on the course.

The mood at the AGM was very upbeat. It had been a very successful year with membership still rising and excellent events run. Offers of help were proffered in several areas. Vacant Committee places were filled from the floor of the meeting, to the extent that we were oversubscribed.

The first committee meeting was also a revelation. Volunteers for committee duties were made readily and with enthusiasm. The new members, although inexperienced, were full of ideas and willing to work alongside more experienced members to learn the ropes in event organisation. The learning curve was steep but everyone rose to the challenge admirably. More organisation on our part meant that offers of help were more efficiently utilised. More offers of help were forthcoming, making event planning a joy rather than a worry and a chore.

It turned out to be a great year. More competitions than ever were put on. Winter / Spring venues proved to be a problem, but with Cholderton House EC and the new MOD venue on the edge of Andover we started the 1999 with two very successful shows. Monthly shows in all disciplines followed. The Combined Training, One Day Event and Hunter Trial were oversubscribed. Some of the other shows didn't have as many entries as we would have liked but were still excellent. All were run with our expected efficiency and friendly atmosphere. 1999 will be remembered for the remarkable weather at our shows. With the exception of the Combined Training which was dry but overcast, every show, from mid March to the end of October was bathed in glorious sunshine. Even more remarkable in a year general remembered for the enormous quantities of torrential rain – flash floods in July and Tractors needed to tow vehicles in and out of shows in August.

The club had a lot of success in inter club Team competitions. The aim, as always, is to find a team place for anyone expressing an interest. 23 members took part in 10 teams. 11 Riders Qualified for Championships in the Novice SJ team, Open SJ individual, Novice and Open HT teams and Open HT Individual. Qualifying for National RC Championships is a real feat. Honours at the Championships is icing on the cake. At the HT Championships five out of nine competitors came away with individual placings, and the Open team missed a team rosette by a whisker. Diana Burgess did exceptionally well with 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> places on her two horses, as well as acting as team coach, the other team members benefitting from her experience. Diana's 1<sup>st</sup> place was achieved against the best in the country. Novice SJ came away with an individual placing too.

Instruction carried on much as before. Thursday evening sessions proved popular this year, whilst Tuesday and weekend lacked support. XC schooling was very worthwhile but that too was not well supported. Rides at Firgo farm were most enjoyable, although we didn't get to Inkpen this year – something we must rectify next year.

The ever popular Hot Cross Bun Ride almost became a victim of its own success with a large turnout. This made the 2 groups large, but thanks to the big open spaces, it proved not to be a problem. The pre Christmas ride from the Bustard is a welcome addition to our calendar.

Apart from the quiz, our Social events were not well supported. This was a real disappointment, and something we are trying to look into for the coming year.

Newsletters still present me with a personal struggle, and I always feel that they are late letting you know what is going on. Although Jemma does the bulk of the work, I still have to arrange dates, dot I's and cross t's. The purchase of another photocopier made life easier. In future, contributions from members would be most welcome.

In summary, it has been another excellent year. Membership stood at 214 at the end of September. More events than ever were organised. The committee rose to the challenge and deserve a vote of thanks for their efforts which belied their inexperience. A good response was received to the pleas for help, offers were made initiated.

One of the pleasures of being Chairman is witnessing members who are thrilled with their own performance at whatever level – achieving something of which they didn't believe themselves capable.

### **Financial Report**

Financially, the club had a successful year. A turnover of £16,000 gave an end of year profit of £200. Assets of a photocopier, several pairs of SJ wings, stands and fillers, SJ arena posts and ropes were purchased. Team costs were high with 3 teams qualifying for Championships, particularly the HT teams which necessitated an over night stay for nine horses. Since the last Open HT team qualified 10 years ago, the cost should be considered to be spread over that period.

### **Committee**

Sarah March stood down as secretary after 4 years and thanks were passed to her in her absence. Sandra Groves was elected as the new secretary. Two vacancies appeared on the committee with Sandra's move and Milly Brotherwod's resignation from the committee. Carol Tennick was elected to the committee. As we were oversubscribed last year, the second place was left vacant.

### **AOB**

Offers were received and accepted from Jill Vallis and the Perren family to run a Novice Show next year. This will be a very welcome addition to the Show season, giving opportunities for members to come and have a go without the pressure of a formal show.

Lively discussion ensued about the possibility of organising a Quadrille team, which Carole Wright has agreed to oversee. The possibility of organising a new 'Le Trek' competition was raised. As this involves a 10 mile orienteering section, thoughts went to previous efforts in this area, and past club members still trying to find their way out of Collingbourne Woods. It was agreed to see if other clubs within Area 17 were organising this competition and how they fared.

### **Presentation of Cups.**

The Caballine Trophy for the helper with the most points was awarded to Sandra Groves with an outstanding 77 points (1 point equates to 1 hour worked). As secretary Sandra is no longer eligible for this competition, so it was great that she won it this year. The Rose Bowl for then highest placed non-committee member was awarded to Sam Woodhouse. Husband Mark was highest placed non-member, and the pair were the highest placed partnership.

The Be Fair competition points Cup was deservedly won by Carole Perren who excelled in all three disciplines throughout the year. Although riding several different horses, often on the same day, she only collected points on one horse on any one day.

The meeting finished with consumption of mulled wine, mince pies, tea & coffee.

## **SUBSCRIPTIONS**

Subscriptions were due for renewal on 1<sup>st</sup> November. There is an increase this year after being pegged at the same level for several years so its good value at £17 Riding Members / £12 Non Riding Members. We are offering a discount of £2 for second and subsequent members of the same household. Please fill and return the membership form (enclosed with the September Newsletter) to Sandra Groves (address on form). There are lots of good things happening so do rejoin soon. If you are considering hunting then you will need a new blue membership card.

Those who have paid since the last Newsletter should find their membership card enclosed.

## RULE REMINDER

The club doesn't have too many rules, but just as a general reminder here are details of the ones that seem to cause most problems.

BVRC membership is open to people 17 years old or older (with no upper age limit). 16 year olds may compete in competitions and attend any riding event as a member's guest, (with permission of the organiser) but BVRC does not allow under 16's to ride at their events. They do however, welcome guests, of any age, at their socials.

Anyone riding at our events **MUST** wear correct approved headgear. The current standard is **at least to the recommended standards PAS015 or EN1384**. Hats shall have a chin strap which has a non-detachable retaining harness secured to the shell at more than two points. Such headgear shall be worn properly adjusted and fastened at all times when mounted. We are not insured if we allow people to ride in incorrect headgear, so please be aware before you turn up and bring the right hat with you.

Body protectors shall be worn for any event involving cross country jumping.

Otherwise there is no particular dress code, it is sufficient just to be "clean and tidy". Correct footwear (i.e. no Muckers) is a good idea. For safety reasons jewellery lovers please note it is not permissible to wear earrings whilst competing, not even studs. Full details of the rules are shown in the club's constitution.
