Equine Microchip Law

New laws surrounding equine identification came into force in England from 1st October 2018,

Defra's new equine identification regulations legally require every horse, pony and donkey to be microchipped and possess a valid UK passport, with details stored in the Central Equine Database (CED).

All horses born after 30 June 2009 are already required to be microchipped.

Owners of horses born before this date will have two years to get their equines microchipped.

From 1st October 2020, it will be an enforceable law.

After this date all horses attending a BRC qualifier or championship must be microchipped.

<u>Vaccinations against EQUINE INFLUENZA – 6 month booster</u>

It is not BVRC policy for horses to be vaccinated against Equine Influenza in order to attend club events, although it is strongly recommended. However, some of the venues used for BVRC Competitions and BRC Area Qualifiers and Championship have stipulated that in order to compete a horse must be vaccinated in accordance with the standard rules (see www.bvrc.org.uk/teams/equine-influenza-vaccinations/) and MUST also have had a vaccination within 6 calendar months and 21 days (but not in any of the 6 preceding days) of the competition and/or entry to competition stables.

BVRC Membership Year

The BVRC Membership Year has run from 1st November until 31st October for many years. At the behest of British Riding Clubs (BRC), we have been instructed to alter the timing to run from 1st January until 31st December. In order to make the adjustment, the year 2019-2020 will commence on 1st November 2019 and run until 31st December 2020, giving 14 months membership for the price of 12. Even more of a bargain than usual!!

BVRC Subscriptions 2019-2020

Well done if you have renewed your subscription.

If not, there is still time to claim a discount of £8 for riding members, if the subs are paid before 31st December 2019.

BVRC club year started on 1st November, so it is time to renew your annual subscriptions for an exciting 2020.

Rates have increased slightly from last year and are £34 for Riding Members, and £12 for Non Riding Members.

We hope that the concession will entice you to renew your subscriptions promptly.

The reduced rate of £26 will also apply for second and subsequent members of the same household.

No discount is applicable for non-riding members, as their rate has not increased for many years.

You will need to renew your subscription if you wish to take advantage of the reduced cap when hunting with the RA Hunt.

Membership renewal can be done online through My Riding Life, for which there is a single transaction cost of £1.50 when you make a "purchase", to cover the cost of the system provided. Otherwise, please fill in the membership renewal form (.pdf version), which can also be found on the BVRC website, and send it with a cheque made payable to Bourne Valley Riding Club, to Celia Scott (address on form).

By providing your details to BVRC you agree to them being used by the Committee to contact you about Club activities, events and requests for help. Information is usually sent out by email from the net@bvrc.co.uk and it is recommended that you save this address, plus nag@bvrc.co.uk, to your Contacts to avoid them going into Spam.

Hunting with RA Hunt

The Club has subscribed to the RA Hunt again this year. This will enable Club members to trail hunt up to 4 times during the season (from November to April) for a reduced cap of £20. The usual cap is £50.

** NEW 2019/2020 **

In order to establish how many members take advantage of the RA Hunt subscription and how many times they hunt, we are trialling a new system for 2019/2020. The current RA Hunt subscription costs members £4/head, irrespective of whether or not they go hunting. We are therefore asking for a contribution of £10/hunt from those who do attend, to offset some of the cost. This will still be a saving of £20/hunt.

As you saw from the recent Caballine results, members gave about 1000 hours to help run events. Not included in the list is help given by non-members, family and friends.

(e.g.hunting, social rides, socials, instruction, demos & team events)

None of the activities happen without help from volunteers. So PLEASE offer your help to the organiser if you can; an hour before, during or after each event helps everything run smoothly for the benefit of all.

To give an example, to run the Horse Trials we need 100 helpers. That could mean a minimum of 100 phone calls.

Whereas, it only takes **ONE** call/email for you to offer help.

PLEASE pick up the phone, email, send a carrier pigeon, somehow, let us know if you can help.

Contact details of the event organisers are given in the newsletters and schedules and it would really help if you could volunteer directly to them as soon as you can.

Towing

There are occasions during the club year when we need to move trailers and caravans to and from competition venues. On three of these we need all six moved. Without them we are unable to run our events. Assistance with fuel costs is available.

BRC Insurance

As a Riding Club affiliated to the British Horse Society, BVRC carries a certain level of insurance cover. It has become apparent that clarification is needed about the insurance cover of individual club members. The policy offers third party personal liability insurance. Members will be insured whilst taking part in activities (riding or helping) organised by BVRC, another BHS affiliated Riding Club or British Riding Clubs office at Stoneleigh. Travel to and from activities is **EXCLUDED**. Members are **NOT INSURED** outside RC activities, e.g. hacking out independently. Further insurance details may be obtained from Susie or calling South Essex Insurance Brokers (SEIB) tel: 0845 450 0634.

BVRC Rule Reminder

The club doesn't have too many rules, but just as a general reminder to keep everyone on the straight and narrow, here are details of the ones that seem to cause most problems.

BVRC membership is open to people 17 years old or older (with no upper age limit). 16 year olds may compete in competitions and attend any riding event as a member's guest, (with permission of the organiser) but BVRC does not allow under 16's to ride at their events. They do, however, welcome guests of any age at the socials.

Everyone mounted, at any BVRC event, shall wear correct riding clothes, which must include 'Protective Headwear', with a harness properly adjusted and fastened.

'Protective Headwear' constitutes a hat meeting one of the following standards:

British PAS 015:1998 or 2011 }Provided they are BSI Kitemarked

European VG1 01.040 2014-12 }or Inspec IC marked

American ASTM F1163: 2004a or 04a onwards Provided they are SEI SNELL E2001 and

SNELL E2016 marked

Australian & New Zealand AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards) Provided they are SAI Global marked

Body protectors (Level 3 - Purple Label year 2009 or later or Blue Label year 2018) shall be worn for any event involving cross-country jumping and are strongly recommended for show jumping. An Airbag style protector, if used, must be worn over a permitted, level 3, body protector. Riders wearing Exo Body Cage protectors must inform the organiser before commencing any cross country.

Medical armbands are no longer mandatory at BRC & BVRC Horse Trials, Hunter Trials and FoTH Challenge competitions, but their use is highly recommended and if used must be worn on the rider's arm.

HEAD CAMS are strictly prohibited at any BRC affiliated competition, including use on the head, chest, bridle or anywhere on horse or rider.

Any item of jewellery including body piercing components and therapeutic medical devices (wristbands) must be covered up by clothing or gloves, if they cannot be removed. This will be done at the rider's own risk.

Suede chaps and half chaps may be worn but must be of identical colour to the boots and have no decoration of any sort. Black or brown polished leather gaiters with matching boots are permitted, too.

Hair must be neatly secured and MUST not hang lower than the shoulder line when standing normally.

Otherwise there is no particular dress code, it is sufficient just to be "clean and tidy". Correct footwear (no Muckers) is a good idea.

BVRC Be Fair (Competition) & Caballine (Helpers)

The Be Fair Cup and Caballine Trophy are presented annually.

Be Fair points are awarded to the 6 highest placed BV members in every competition regardless of their overall places (they may be 10th in the class but 2nd best BV member). Riders are only eligible for points on one horse on any particular day.

Members who compete in teams on behalf of the BVRC will receive three points per day.

The Caballine Trophy points are awarded on a point for each hour or part hour worked at a show or setting up the day before a show. Committee members who organise the events only get points on this basis and not for other committee duties. Even so, the top places do seem to be filled by them. A rose bowl is awarded to the highest placed non-committee member.

In addition to the trophies, rosettes are presented to the top ten places in each competition. Each Trophy winner is awarded free membership for the following year.

Be Fair

The Be Fair trophy and a year's membership was awarded to the member attaining the most points in competition throughout the year. Rosettes were presented to the top ten riders.

Congratulations to Kay Pogson, who is the winner of the Be Fair Trophy in 2019, by a wide margin. Kay attends BVRC events and participates in team events whenever possible.

80 members gained competition points this year. Congratulations to everyone who made an appearance on the points board. The number of members gaining points is indicative of quantity and diversity of competitions we are able to run throughout the year.

BVRC Residential Camp at Stockland Lovell, Somerset, Monday 20th April – Thursday 23rd April 2020

We return to our normal mid-April slot for camp, next year. Arrival will be on Monday 20th April between 12-1pm and departure after lunch on Thursday 23rd April.

Accommodation consists of furnished heated log cabins/barns of various sizes, containing 3-6 bunk beds, divans, mirror, chairs and hooks for clothing. Residents will need to take their own bedding including pillows. Shower block, loos, dining room and lounge are available on the premises.

Full catering will be provided and includes English breakfast, cold lunch, afternoon cakes and 2 course evening meal.

Stabling will be in an American style barn with hay and straw included. Hard food will not be supplied, so we will need to take our own.

The facilities at Stockland Lovell include

an extensive cross country course with in excess of 100 fences from 1'6" to 3'9", two all weather arenas (one for flatwork and one with show jumps), marked routes for hacking around the farm saddlery shop.

The plan is to have six riding sessions, Monday afternoon, 2 each on Tuesday and Wednesday and one on Thursday morning. All horse must have a current flu vaccination certificate, which includes a 6 month booster. Certificates will be checked on arrival.

The most remarkable result came in the Novice class with a win for husband & wife, Kathy & Gary Emery. Kathy rode at the beginning of the class & Gary rode at end. They finished on identical scores, each jumping clear & finishing spot on the optimum time. That saved an argument on the way home!

After 150 rounds (175 riders), we still managed to finish the day within 5 minutes of our 3pm schedule. Final scores were produced promptly, by our amazing scoring team. People materialised from nowhere to help pack up and we left the site before 4pm – remarkable!

After the disappointment of the Horse Trials in July, it was a great relief that the Hunter Trials proved popular and has given BVRC finances a much needed boost.

It was definitely a mixed bag of a weekend, as is often the case. The nice thing about being in a team or even as an individual with other Club members, if you have a bad day, you can perk yourself up enjoying the achievements of others. Sadly for the 90 team, Jaffa pulled a sicky the day before and, to be on the safe side and ensure he was fit for the Blenheim Team Challenge 4 days later, Briony stayed at home. Although it could mean that the pressure is on for the other team members because there is no discard score, I tend to think that luck is not on our side, the stars are not aligned and it's not going to happen for us – so just go and have fun \odot !

The luck was against poor Kay too. Having driven down the afternoon before to walk the courses (this is a show jumping course followed immediately by cross country), she jumped a wrong fence in the SJ and was eliminated. I thought it was very unfriendly of them not to allow her to go XC, having gone all that way, twice! The problem with cheffing and competing at the same time, I wasn't around to argue her case. Frances defied the laws of luck and produced an excellent double clear in the 80 and only 4 seconds under the Optimum Time. As only finishing exactly on the Optimum Time is penalty free and 0.4 penalties are awarded for every second over or under the Optimum Time, it is exceedingly difficult/lucky to get round faultless (no stopwatches allowed). Frances' score was good enough for 2nd place and as the 1st placed rider was in the winning team, Frances should have qualified for the Championships – Well Done!

My fellow team-mates in the 90 knew not to have high expectations of Dubai and me as we tend to have major problems getting started/round at Moreton. Out of 3 attempts, we have only completed (but went clear!) once and that was in the FOTH Challenge 80 Qualifier in the Spring. It seems that Dubai much prefers this start point (halfway round the course) to the normal start, as she again set off confidently and my hopes of finishing well rose with every jump. Unfortunately, the rider (me) ignored the Chef d'Equipe's (also me) orders to not attempt the open ditch but jump the black flag alternative and this resulted in 20 jumping and a lot of time faults. Smacked wrist!!! For Helen and Stephen, most of their penalties were accrued as time penalties in the show jumping. Helen was focused on getting a good rhythm in the canter and fell foul of the faster than usual SJ speed. "Betty" had a complete meltdown, partly due to a very vocal steward, and at 1 penalty/second in the SJ, it gets very expensive very fast. They made up for it on the XC but 45s too fast is as expensive as too slow!!
