Hunter Trial at Larkhill on Sunday 29th October at 9.30am.

Schedules for this event were sent out earlier, in August. This year, we are hosting Area 17 Open Hunter Trials Qualifier, and for this reason the Open Class will be the first of the day. There are plenty of classes for non team participants, ranging from 2'3" to 3'6". So **PLEASE** get your entries in early. If for any reason you are not willing or able to ride please come and help. Fence judges are always in short supply so volunteers are very welcome. Fences need to be manned from 9.30am to 4pm. We usually allocate people in two stints so helpers can opt for morning or afternoon, but even if you can only manage a couple of hours this would be very useful. If you haven't already received a fence judge letter and can help, please fill in the attached reply slip, or phone Maureen Burford (01264) 781499 / Carol Tennick (01264) 391378 (fence judge co-ordinators) or Lindsay Hills (01264) 772388 (organiser) to offer your services.

Hunter Trial Course Walk with Diana Burgess on Saturday 28th October.

Diana will be conducting two course walking rounds at Larkhill on Saturday 28th October. Come and find out from an expert how it should be done. Even if you are not riding the following day, came and get some tips on approach to fences, how to ride a corner, drop, or coffin. Maximise your chances of jumping a clear round.

Area 17 Hunter Novice & Open Hunter Trials Team Qualifier.

Area 17 have got organised this year and are holding qualifying competitions for the National RC Hunter Trials Championships which are scheduled for April 2001. The Novice and Open qualifiers are to be held locally on consecutive weekends at the end of October. The Novice competition will be run on Sunday 22nd October at Dene Farm, Nether Wallop, and we are hosting the Open qualifier with our own Hunter Trial on the 29th October.

Enclosed with this newsletter is an application form for team places. If you wish to be considered, please fill in the form and return it to Sam Mawer, by the **20**th **September**, together with a photocopy of the horse's Flu Vacc certificate. The photocopy should be legible and include all details (i.e. front, back, middle, sides and all other parts of the form.).

There are two main requirements for members wishing to take part in the above competitions.

- 1. The horse must be owned by a club member or a documented long term lease agreement be in existence.
- 2. The horse must have valid up to date Flu Vaccination Certificate which must comply in every respect to the rules shown below.

There is a rule in place prohibiting practising over any part of the course during the three week prior to the competitions. For anyone wishing to do our Open Qualifier, they will not be able to enter the equivalent height course at the RA & Army Hunter Trial at Larkhill on October 15th.

The team selection policy is as follows:

On the basis of the response of the Team forms, a decision is made about how many teams are entered. Selection team for places is based on performance at club competitions or other known events.

It is normally the case that, subject to eligibility, anyone keen to take part will be offered a team place.

If you think you would like to have a go but are not sure then ring Sam for a chat. Otherwise, even if you stated on your membership application that you were interested in teams, please fill in and return your form.

The club pays all Entry Fees to Area competitions.

Equine Influenza - Valid Certificates - Vaccination procedures

Each horse must have a valid vaccination certificate, which undeniably relates to that horse, completed, **signed and stamped** on each line by a veterinary surgeon, who is not the owner of the animal. It must state that the horse has two injections for primary vaccination against Equine Influenza given no less than 21 days and no more than 92 days apart. (Only these two injections need to have been given for the horse to compete). In addition a first booster injection must be given no less than 150 days and no more than 215 days after the second injection of the primary vaccination. Subsequently, booster injections must be given at intervals of not more than 1 year apart, commencing after the first booster injection. None of these injection must have been given within the preceding 7 days, including the day of the competition or entry into competition stables.

Horses foaled before 1st January 1980 need not have had the first booster injection (no less 150 days and no more than 215 days) after the second injection of the primary vaccination – but must have had an annual booster (given within 12 months) thereafter.

Well done to all concerned. With fifteen riders and seventeen horses all completing the course with very few penalties this was an outstanding performance. Probably this was a record representation for our club at an Area Event.

Yet again everyone jumped out of their skin, and enjoyed themselves. Five of the eight teams members jumped clear in the first round of the Novice competition. Luckily four were from the same team, leaving them as one of five of the original fourteen on a zero score. Poor Veronica was nearly jumped off over one fence, with the result that she missed out the next fence. This was a great shame, as due to some "dubious" rules she was unable to jump in the second round. The second round sorted the men from the boys. A clear winner, with a zero team score, were the New Forest Pony Enthusiasts. Thirteen individual double clears which included Carole & Jessica, jumped off for individual honours. Carole had it in the bag until tipping the very last rail in the jump off, but still finished 5th individually. One of our teams, on a final score of 8 faults, also finished in 5th place.

Unfortunately, Miranda's horse went lame on the morning of the competition, leaving one Open team with 3 members. Consistent jumping over two large tracks provided a hotly contested competition. Karen's mare, brought into the team at the last minute, was having an off day and knocked a couple of fences in each round. The others all finished just faulting once in each round. Lynn performed and immaculate clear in the second round only to discover she had started before the bell. It can happen to anyone, as Andrew Davis discovered when jumping in a Nations Cup team for Great Britain. The final result was very close with the New Forest finishing on 7 1/4 faults and us on 8 faults. It's a long time since we have had an Open team in contention. Three of the New Forest members proclaimed it was the biggest track they had ever jumped. They may be in for a shock at the Championships! Four double clears jumped off for individual places, with Diana jumping into 3rd place with Bettee. Holly also gave Diana 5th place with her single stop in the first round and clear second round.

Area 17 Team Dressage Qualifier Nr Fordingbridge, 6th August 2000

Again there was a lot of interest in this competition. In each team, one rider does a Prelim test, 2 ride Novice Tests and the 4th rider performs an Elementary test. The majority of interest was for the Prelim and maybe the Novice test, but very few willing or able to do the Elementary test. National Riding Club Horse Trials Championships at Offchurch Bury, 11th - 13th August 2000

Extract from Jerry's Notebook (by Jerry Bugden)

Unless you are competing at a high level, normally these events (dressage, show jumping and cross country) are held only on one day. However, a special centenary celebration, the National Riding Clubs' organisers and sponsors on this occasion (South Essex Insurance Brokers) decided to plan the Open event over three days and the Novice event over two days. For the Novice event, day one being the dressage and show jumping (with a walk of the cross-course in the evening). Day two would involve roads and tracks, steeplechase, more roads and tracks followed by the cross country course consisting of 19 various jumps (two through water).

Horse and rider have to be very fit - yours truly was tired after just cycling the roads and tracks (two sections totalling approximately 7 miles - with no jumps, just tracks, paths, some bridleways and fields, having to be ridden within at a certain time). In the Open class the steeplechase is like small chase fences, but in the Novice class this part of day two consists of two circuits of three hurdles that needed to be jumped in 2 minutes or under. Many of the horses, including our own, had not come up against these types of obstacles laid out in this manner. All the horses I watched appeared to love this element (some of them too much, 'General' nearly bolted after one circuit, getting fairly close to an early bath in the adjacent lake.) The majority of horses taking part in the 'steeplechase' section really assisted their riders by measuring out the final strides so that they were not "short" or "long" on take off. The whole weekend was real eye-opener.

Report by Kay Bugden

One week before the Horse Trials Championships I had a phone call from Lindsay asking if I would be in the BV Novice Team as Jane Mann was unable to go, so could I take her place? Suzanne Cawley also had a similar phone whilst sunning herself on a beach in Ibiza. This time to replace Carolyn Carter whose horse was unfit.

I was very excited about going but also very nervous as Gwinnie and I had never been to a Championships like this before. However, I arranged transport with Miranda, and quickly started to learn and practice the dressage test. We planned to depart on Friday 10th Aug pm. Lindsay had booked stables for the horses and I had booked a B&B for Friday & Saturday nights.

On Friday morning I had a phone call from Miranda saying that unfortunately Hilton had gone lame overnight (a recurrence of his previous lameness a fortnight earlier) and so now the team was only three members. I then started to panic Eventually transport was organised and I arrived in Offchurch on Friday at about 9pm, Suzanne and Diana arrived early next morning.

On Saturday, as I was plaiting Gwinnie, Lindsay arrived, and as I was number 1 in our team my dressage was quite early. After the dressage we had the Show Jumping, everything was planned and organised very well.

When all three team members had completed their Dressage and Show Jumping at about 6pm, we all walked the cross country course together. Diana was a great help and gave us lots of useful tips. We also walked the steeplechase course 'Phase B', which consisted of six fences which had to be ridden at a speed of 500m/min. There was also Roads & Tracks, 'Phase A & C'. My husband, Jerry, and I borrowed bicycles to go around this. I was surprised how far we had to ride and how fast we had to go so as not to receive any time penalties.

Sunday morning I was up early and ready to start. The weather was reasonable, but heavy showers came later in the day. Gwinnie and I had a lovely day and greatly enjoyed the steeplechase and cross country. I was exhausted, but Gwinnie still had lots of energy! All the team helped each other and Lindsay was always close by. It was a great experience for us just to compete in a competition like this. Although as a team we were unplaced, we all received a commemorative Championship rosette to remember the day.

Well done to the three team members who eventually made it to Offchurch. Three performances to be proud of in a strange environment with the added pressure of overnight stays. Good dressage marks of Gwinnie 32, General 26, and Lamp Light (Ellie) 24 gave them a good start. Gwinnie and General show jumped clear, but Ellie's exuberance got the better of her and she had two fences down. The roads & tracks and steeplechase posed no problems aside from General's detour, nearly mowing us down in his extra loop on the steeplechase. The XC too was not a problem for Gwinnie & General. Gwinnie had one stop when surprised by a drop fence with no apparent landing. General jumped round clear, but severe breaking, steering problem deemed it necessary to ride with caution. Both horses found the XC speed too fast for them on this occasion. Ellie, having already crossed water on the roads & tracks and also jumped through a water crossing earlier on the course decided she didn't want to play anymore half way around the course. Thanks to the team members for their enthusiasm and dedication, particularly to Diana for sharing her experience, and supporting the

other team members.

Congratulations go to other club members, who although not representing BVRC on this occasion, had excellent individual results at Offchurch.
