BRC Insurance

As a Riding Club affiliated to the British Horse Society, BVRC carries a certain level of insurance cover. It has become apparent that clarification is needed about the insurance cover of individual club members. The policy offers third party personal liability insurance. Members will be insured whilst taking part in activities (riding or helping) organised by BVRC, another BHS affiliated Riding Club or British Riding Clubs office at Stoneleigh. Travel to and from activities is **EXCLUDED**. Members are **NOT INSURED** outside RC activities, e.g. hacking out independently. British Riding Clubs Rule Book

British Riding Clubs' Competitions Official Rules book is now available to view online on the BHS / Riding Clubs website. All BVRC competitions are run under BRC Rules. Members who compete may wish to familiarise themselves with rules /eligibility and with dress / tack rules. Changes to Hat Standards (BS EN 1384 / EN 1384) from 2016

Following the recent announcement, the riding helmet standard BS EN 1384 is to be withdrawn as a permitted hat standard. British Riding Clubs & BVRC will permit BS EN 1384 hats in 2015 but not thereafter.

BVRC Rule Reminder

The club doesn't have too many rules, but just as a general reminder to keep everyone on the straight and narrow, here are details of the ones that seem to cause most problems.

BVRC membership is open to people 17 years old or older (with no upper age limit). 16 year olds may compete in competitions and attend any riding event as a member's guest, (with permission of the organiser) but BVRC does not allow under 16's to ride at their events. They do, however, welcome guests of any age at the socials.

Everyone mounted, whether or not a competitor, shall wear correct riding clothes, which must include 'Protective Headwear', with a harness properly adjusted and fastened.

'Protective Headwear' constitutes a hat meeting one of the following standards:

British PAS 015:1998 or 2011, BSEN1384:1997 or 2012 } Provided they are European EN1384:1996 } BSI Kitemarked

American All SEI, ASTM F1163:2004a, 04a SNELL E2001

Australian & New Zealand All SAI AS/NZS 3838 2006

Standards PAS015 and ASTM F1163 are considered to offer greater protection than EN1384 or BSEN1384.

Skullcaps must be worn with an appropriate coloured silk.

Please be aware before you turn up that you bring the right hat with you to every single riding event & competition that we run.

Body protectors (Level 3 - Purple Label year 2000 or 2009) shall be worn for any event involving cross-country jumping and are strongly recommended for show jumping. An Airbag style protector, if used, must be worn over a permitted, level 3, body protector. Riders wearing Exo Body Cage protectors must inform the organiser before commencing any cross country.

Medical armbands (armbands issued by BE and BRC) are mandatory at Club Horse Trials, Hunter Trials and FoTH competitions and MUST BE WORN ON THE RIDER'S ARM.

Jewellery including body piercing components and therapeutic medical devices (wristbands) must be removed. If removal is not possible, items must be covered up by clothing or gloves. This will be done at the rider's own risk.

Suede chaps and half chaps may be worn but must be of identical colour to the boots and have no decoration of any sort. Black or brown polished leather gaiters with matching boots are permitted, too.

Long hair should be worn in a net or secured in such way as not to hang below the collar.

There are horrific reports of long hair being entangled in a jump wing and large lumps of hair being torn out at the roots.

Otherwise there is no particular dress code, it is sufficient just to be "clean and tidy". Correct footwear (no Muckers) is a good idea.

BVRC Be Fair Cup and Caballine Trophy

The Be Fair Cup and Caballine Trophy are presented annually. See below for 2104 Results

Be Fair points are awarded to the 6 highest placed BV members in every competition regardless of their overall places (they may be 10th in the class but 2nd best BV member). Riders are only eligible for points on one horse on any particular day.

Members who compete in teams on behalf of the BVRC will receive three points per day.

The Caballine Trophy points are awarded on a point for each hour or part hour worked at a show or setting up the day before a show. Committee members who organise the events only get points on this basis and not for other committee duties. Even so, the top places do seem to be filled by them. A rose bowl is awarded to the highest placed non-committee member.

In addition to the trophies, rosettes are presented to the top ten places in each competition.

Each Trophy winner is awarded free membership for the following year.

BVRC Residential Camp at Stockland Lovell, Somerset 27th April -30th April 2015

The residential camp has been booked at Stockland Lovell. Arrival will be on Monday 27th April between 12-1pm and departure after lunch on Thursday 30th April. Accommodation consists of furnished heated portacabins of various sizes, containing 2-6 bunk beds, divans, mirror, chairs and hooks for clothing. Residents will need to take their own bedding including pillows. Shower block, loos, dining room and lounge are available on the premises.

Full catering will be provided and includes English breakfast, cold lunch, afternoon cakes and 2 course evening meal. Stabling will be in an American style barn with hay and shavings included. Hard food will not be supplied, so we will need to take our own.

All horse must have a current flu vaccination certificate, which will be checked on arrival.

PLEASE READ THE VACCINATION RULES BELOW AND CHECK THAT YOUR HORSE'S CERTIFICATE COMPLIES IN EVERY RESPECT.

The facilities at Stockland Lovell include

an extensive cross country course with in excess of 100 fences from 1'6" to 3'9",

two all weather arenas (one for flatwork and one with show jumps),

marked routes for hacking around the farm

saddlery shop.

The plan is to have six riding sessions, Monday afternoon, 2 each on Tuesday and Wednesday and one on Thursday morning.

Please indicate on the booking form the type (hacking, flatwork, gridwork, show jumping or cross country) and how many sessions of riding you would like to do (not more than 2 of each jumping type, maximum of 6 sessions). We can't promise, but we will do our best to satisfy your choice.

Costs, based on attendance by 20-24 people, are made up as follows:

accommodation, stabling (including shavings & hay/haylage), hire of arenas & cross country course catering (breakfast, lunch & evening meal)

£40/per day £26/per day

instructors

Hence the cost this year will be £290 of which a £90 deposit shall be paid on return of the attached application form (no later than 13th March) and the remainder will be payable on or before 2nd April. A second horse may be brought, if space permits, at a cost of £84.

Apart from under exceptional circumstances, payment will only be refunded if your allocated space can be filled.

Our allocation is for 40-45 people / horses. Places will be allocated on a first come, first served basis.

FLU VAC RULES

BRC equine influenza rules are based on the British Horseracing Authority Rules (BHA formerly The Jockey Club Rules).

Equine Influenza - Valid Certificates - Vaccination procedures

Each horse must have a valid vaccination certificate, which undeniably relates to that horse, completed, <u>signed and stamped</u> on each relevant line by a veterinary surgeon, who is not the owner of the animal.

It must state that the horse has received the appropriate course of injections against Equine Influenza as follows:

Two injections, the 2^{nd} between 21 days and 92 days after the 1^{st} . **Primary Vaccination**:

First Booster: An injection between 150 days and 215 days after 2nd primary injection.

Annual Booster An injection not more than 1 year after the preceding injection.

Only the first two injections need to have been given for the horse to compete.

None of the vaccinations may be given within the preceding 7 days, including the day of the competition or entry into competition stables.

Annual Boosters may be given on the same date each year, but this is not recommended.

Horses foaled before 1st January 1980 need not have had the first booster injection (no less 150 days and no more than 215 days) after the second injection of the primary vaccination – but must have had an annual booster (given within 12 months) thereafter.

Note: Where Passports are used as the flu' vaccination record, the horse description must be verified by a vet or authorised member of a breed society.

If the passport does not contain the full vaccination history then, to comply with rule above, the flu vaccination certificate must also accompany the pony/horse to all BRC Qualifiers and Championships.

It is worth remembering

There is now a legal requirement for a valid passport to accompany the horse when traveling to any competition.

BRC Area 17 Novice & Intermediate Winter Show Jumping Qualifier at Crofton EC, Stubbington, Hants on


Sunday 22nd February 2015,

BRC Area 17 Intermediate Winter Dressage Team Qualifier at Woodington Training Centre on Saturday 28th and Sunday 29th March 2015

The inaugural Intermediate Winter Dressage Qualifier and will be held on Saturday 28th and Sunday 29th March at Woodington Training Centre, East Wellow, SO51 6DQ. The Championships, at Bury Farm, Leighton Buzzard, will be over the same weekend as the Intermediate Indoor Show Jumping (2nd & 3rd May 2015).

The competition is for teams of 4 riders, with the best 3 scores to count towards the team total. One or two teams will qualify from each Area but there will not be any individuals to qualify.

Each rider does a different test, either Prelim 13 (2006), Novice 28 (2008), Novice 34 (2009) or Elementary 42 (2008).



BVRC Hot Cross Bun Social Ride, Bulford/Tidworth Road, Good Friday 3rd April 2015, 10.15am

This year's Hot Cross Bun ride across Salisbury Plain will start and finish opposite the 'F' Range firing area mid-way between Bulford and Tidworth on the range road. The turning is Bulford side of the Cross Belt (on Tidworth / Bulford road. (Cross Belt marks the Hampshire Wiltshire border)). Parking will be on the open grass by the trees, opposite the entrance to the clearly signposted F Range – watch for the orange BVRC signs to zero you in.

BRC Area 17 Festival of the Horse Challenge (Combined Show Jumping & Cross Country) Sunday 6th April 2015,

Rockbourne

A combined show jumping and cross country challenge with classes for Intermediate (height 1m all fences), Novice (height SJ .85m SC .90m) and Pairs (height as Novice; SJ phase will be run as a pairs relay. The XC will include up to 3 dressing fences). This competition is a test of the ability of a pony/horse and rider to negotiate a show jumping course together with a cross country course. The Challenge will involve a round of 7-10 show jumping obstacles and at least 15 (max 28) cross country jumping efforts. The round will be timed, with the show jumping based on a speed of 325 m/min for all and the cross country 450 m/min for novice and pairs and 475 m/min for intermediate.

Other combinations will be welcome to ride, HC, in the classes for which they are ineligible. In the spirit of the competition, professional riders are welcome but requested to ride HC.

There are Walk And Trot or Prelim standard dressage tests and show jumping clear round at 2'0" followed by SJ classes between 2'0" and 2'6". She participated in activities in and around Tidworth Garrison, including the Military Tattoo on what is now, Tidworth Polo Ground. Following the war, Sylvia introduced and shared her love with her family. Husband, Sam, learnt to ride aged 32 years. All three children experienced the delights of pony club (RA) as well as family rides on Salisbury Plain. When the idea of the Bourne Valley Riding Club was mooted, Sylvia embraced the idea wholeheartedly, attending the inaugural meeting. Soon she and Lindsay became members, although it took Sam a further couple of years to be persuaded. Early club activities included rides from other members' houses. Convinced, by these outings that club activities weren't just going to be riding around in circles in an arena, not only did Sam become a member, but soon undertook the Chairmanship. During his thirteen year tenure as Chairman, Sylvia supported Sam and all the club activities, she herself serving on the committee. She enjoyed many club instruction sessions and was even persuaded to take part in a team competition. Sylvia owned Highland Fling, the first horse to represent BVRC at National Championships.

Sylvia and Sam continued to hunt with the RA for many years, whilst still supporting and maintaining a keen interest in club life.

After Sam died in 2002, Sylvia was made an honorary member and continued to follow club events. Always keen to do her bit, she continued to fence judge until her 90th year, after which she reluctantly retired. Sylvia had a long & happy association with BVRC.
