BRC Area 17 FotH Challenge (Combined Show Jumping & Cross Country) Monday 6th April 2015, Rockbourne

A combined show jumping and cross country challenge with classes for Intermediate (height 1m all fences), Novice (height SJ .85m SC .90m) and Pairs (height as Novice; SJ phase will be run as a pairs relay. The XC will include up to 3 dressing fences). This competition is a test of the ability of a pony/horse and rider to negotiate a show jumping course together with a cross country course. The Challenge will involve a round of 7-10 show jumping obstacles and at least 15 (max 28) cross country jumping efforts. The round will be timed, with the show jumping based on a speed of 325 m/min for all and the cross country 450 m/min for novice and pairs and 475 m/min for intermediate.

Applicants for this competition have enabled us to enter one Novice team and one Intermediate individual.



BVRC Talk – on Thursday 9th April - The Lion at Clanville, Nr Weyhill 7.45pm -FARRIERY - PAST, PRESENT & AFRICA

Cliff Barnes, AWCf Master Farrier, will be covering the latest thinking & key developments in farriery, as well as his experiences training local farriers in Tanzania. There will be time to cover one or two specific areas as requested by the audience - eg laminitis, sidebone, tendon injuries, navicular - as well as any Q&As.

Cliff has been caring for horses' feet in the local area since qualifying in 1993. He became an Associate of the Worshipful Company of Farriers in 2013 and continues to improve his skills and knowledge towards becoming a Fellow (FWCF) in the future. In 2013 he also became President of the British Farriers & Blacksmiths Association, after several years on the Executive Committee.

He is passionate about training, both in the UK and Africa, to maintain and improve standards for the benefit of horses everywhere.

BVRC Novice Show Saturday 18th April, 2015 from 1pm, Amport Riding Centre

This popular show is for novice riders and horses in any combination or for those who have had a break from competition and would like to return in a low-key fashion. The competition is organised to encourage riders and/or horses who have not been placed 1st, 2nd or 3rd in dressage or show jumping classes. This year, classes will be extended to include Novice combinations who aren't eligible for strict Novice Horse/Rider classifications. Other combinations will be welcome to ride, HC, in the classes for which they are ineligible. In the spirit of the competition, professional riders are welcome but requested to ride HC.

There are Walk And Trot or Prelim standard dressage tests and show jumping clear round at 2'0" followed by SJ classes between 2'0" and 2'6". BRC Area 17 Combined Training Team & Individual Qualifier at Crofton EC, Stubbington, on Sunday 19th April 2015,

The Combined Training qualifier for teams and individuals comprise two levels, one riding Prelim 7 (2002) and showing jumping at 75cm and the second riding Novice27 (2007) with a show jumping jump a round at 85cm. Teams comprise four members with two riding at each level. As always, the best three scores count towards the team total. Two teams have been entered for this competition.



BVRC Unaffiliated Horse Trials at Larkhill on Sunday 17th May 2015

This year our annual Horse Trials returns to its normal format. The competition will be run with cross country at 75cm, 85-90cm and 1m, so there will be a height for everyone.

Classes will soon be filling for this very popular event, so places will be at a premium.

Entries will be processed on a first come first served basis. Please get yours in early. We don't want to disappoint anybody because the classes are full.

The event is the major revenue earner for the club and a mammoth task to organise. In order to run efficiently and maintain high levels of safety for all concerned, we need about 100 helpers, either on the preceding morning, at 10am, to set up, on the day itself or to clear up at 4pm.

Without you contacting us, it could entail 100 telephone calls.

Last week I heard a chap (psychologist?) talking on the radio about how to be happy. He said to find things to do which give you a sense of achievement, and find things to do which you enjoy. At the Area 17 Winter SJ Qualifier I had a MASSIVE sense of achievement and also enjoyed myself, somehow without getting stressed. Perhaps due to prior planning and getting up at 4am! I took 2 horses, and jumped 5 rounds, all different courses, 3 on my own Humphrey and 2 on the newly loaned Dubai.

I was SO proud of Humphrey who didn't have one stop all day, which is very unusual for him. In the 70-80cm warm up he actually went clear in the 1st phase so we got to do the jump-off phase (I only walked it just in case!). He nearly stopped at the last, a pink and purple double, but I actually kicked on, he responded and we only had the first element down. We came 7th!! In the Qualifier, he jumped clear in the 1st round (80cm) and had 2 down in the 2nd (85cm), that wretched pink & purple double again. A very delighted rider.

Dubai was great but we need to work on our communications skills. However I'd only had her 2 weeks, jumped her 3 times and it was our first competition together so we are still trying to get to know each other. I demonstrated how out of practice I was when in Round 1 (90-95cm), I found I was only concentrating on the fence in hand until after landing, hence I sailed past 2 jumps saying "bother" I'm supposed to be jumping that one next! On the drive home I worked out that I probably haven't jumped a 90+cm course for over 6 years, I think on the lovely "Jeebs", then owned by Gill Young. Dubai tried to look after me and put up with my incompetence well, but there came a point of impossibility in Round 2 which necessitated a stop. At that point I "dismounted" onto my feet, patted her and led her out of the arena!!

In the short time I've been riding and jumping Dubai, she has brought me on so that I can jump Humphrey much better too; more positively and confidently. Thank you Victoria Delville-Cutts for giving me the opportunity.

It was good to be part of Bourne Valley Riding Club teams, riding for a change, so thanks to Katie Mortimore for standing in as Chef d'Equipe for the day and helping me out when needed. There was some great team spirit around. I also have to thank Meredith Baker's Mum, Sue for taking me under her wing as soon as they arrived and helping me with numbers and hat tagging. Tabitha Rothwell kindly acted as one of our helpers when her pony went lame, preventing her from competing and Victoria's noble husband, Gareth, was a chauffeur, groom and also designated official for the afternoon so a big thank you owed there.

Feel very chuffed that I coped with getting 2 living-out horses to an early competition, reasonably turned out (thank goodness I didn't need to plait though) and did all the horse swapping pretty much on my own. I couldn't have done it without having previously worked with Marion Watt, who does it all the time, usually with 3!

At the end of the day, none of the teams did very well but there were several other achievements. In keeping with the Novice competition, Victoria took a very inexperienced horse, who a week earlier could hardly jump out of canter. She improved each training session and then did a couple of pretty decent rounds at Crofton. Louise produced our only double clear for the day, and Annabel Mead's young Wujiwoo performed best of the Intermediate horses. Lisa overcame her nerves to jump 2 creditable rounds in the Intermediate and even enjoyed the experience, as did Sandra in the Novice. They both decided they want to jump more often as a result, which is a great outcome. Well done all, and I'm glad everyone got home safely with the strengthening wind gusting over 30 mph.
