CHANGE IN HAT STANDARDS for 2023

From 1 January 2023, BRC will no longer be accepting two hat standards. In order to ensure riders are wearing the most up-to-date riding hats, please note that from the 1 January 2023, the following hat standards will no longer be accepted, due to the age of hats made to these standards:

- 1. PAS O15 1998
- 2. SNELL 2001

The requirement from 1st January onwards will be as follows (old standards are crossed through):

Everyone mounted shall wear correct riding clothes, which must include 'Protective Headwear', with a harness properly adjusted and fastened. 'Protective Headwear' constitutes a hat meeting one of the following standards:

British PAS 015 (1998 or 2011) } Provided they are BSI Kitemarked

European VG1 01.040 (2014-12) } or Inspec IC marked

American ASTM F1163 (2004a or 04a onwards) Provided they are marked SEI

SNELL E2001 or SNELL E2016 Provided they have official SNELL label & number

Australian & New Zealand AS/NZS 3838 (2006 onwards) Provided they are SAI global marked

A new colour of hat tag will be required for BE, PC and BRC Area qualifiers & Championships from 1 January 2023

BVRC Residential Camp at Stockland Lovell, Somerset, Monday 24th April – Thursday 27th April 2023 – Dates Confirmed

Arrival will be on Monday 24th April between 12-1pm and departure after lunch on Thursday 27th April.

Accommodation consists of furnished heated log cabins/barns of various sizes, containing 3-6 bunk beds, divans, mirror, chairs and hooks for clothing. Residents will need to take their own bedding including pillows. Shower block, loos, dining room and lounge are available on the premises

Full catering will be provided and includes English breakfast, cold lunch, afternoon cakes and 2 course evening meal.

BVRC Farrier Talk - Thursday 20th October

Fifteen people enjoyed listening to Jack Girling's talk, our first one since 2020!

Jack covered a variety of topics, including the challenges our horses' hooves face from the increasingly extreme and rapid changes between wet and dry weather we now experience, particularly in southern England.

The Thoroughbred owners were pleased to hear their horses could "wear heels"; it is all about how they are trimmed. Jack shared pictures of the immediate changes a rehabilitative trim can achieve for a horse. Barefoot trims and shoeing for different purposes and different breeds were also discussed.

BVRC Table Top Tack Sale, Saturday 19th November

This was the first opportunity to hold a tack sale after the inaugural success of 2019. It too proved to be popular. Tables sold quickly and a waiting list established. We were caught out by the early arrival of vendors. Keen to get set up in good time, a lengthy queue formed at least 30 minutes before the doors opened. A further delayed ensued as we tried to find the promised number of tables. Still, the doors opened by 11am and people scuttled back and forth, laying out their tables to display their wares.

A steady trickle of buyers arrived to peruse the goods on offer and many transaction were completed. Tea, coffee and cake helped proceeding. In seemed no time at all before packing up started. All was clear by 4pm. Parking had been a challenge, but all in all it was a good day. Thanks to Val for organising, to those who contributed delicious cakes and to Fiona Gregory who dished out tea.

BVRC Hunter Trial Sunday 30th October 2022, Larkhill

I was able to breathe a huge sigh of relief on completion of the successful Hunter Trial, the last competition of the year.

What a great day we had. In the light of the extremely wet weather experienced in all surrounding villages and everywhere in the days that followed, we were very lucky. Perhaps it was compensation for the storms we encountered last year. The BVRC trailers were stranded in the middle of our lawn for a month, unable to be returned to their storage place in the field.

The lead up to the event encountered the usual but unexpected dramas. The Brazilian vet I booked in March suddenly discovered he had to vote in the second round of Brazilian elections in London between 8am & 5pm on the 30th. It was a mandatory requirement. Penalties for not voting were onerous and the massive repercussions included fines and rejection to renew passport or open bank accounts in Brazil. Fortunately, he was able to find a replacement, without which we would be unable to run the event.

A few days before the event, XC Controller, Karen went down with covid. This also meant her husband, Steve, was unavailable. Again, this is a key role that is essential and we couldn't run without. My desperation must have leapt out of the email to Graham and he stepped in to the breech, doing an excellent job.

Entries flowed in steadily and by the close we surpassed our quota. An expectation that withdrawals would reduce the numbers wasn't met and the 25 on the waiting list were disappointed.

It isn't that I am greedy for more revenue - I just hate disappointing people and turning them away.

Reasons given for entering late and missing the closing date made me smile. They were akin to school excuses like 'the dog ate my homework'.

Mindful of limited day light hours, the number of entries had to be tightly controlled so times were allocated with the aid of a shoehorn.

Help, as always, was difficult to find. So, we are all extremely grateful to all who generously gave up their time. Sandra leapt into action to fill the gaps, but it seems increasingly difficult to elicit any response to pleas for help. Emails, phone calls, phone messages and texts are ignored. It is frustrating, phones have become an extra appendage, instant communication essential, but the constant bombardment of messages has become overwhelming and as a consequence many are ignored.

After shuffling a few jobs around and earmarking a couple of fence judges to cover two fences, all roles were filled.

On Saturday, in balmy conditions, the team erected the two gazebos and positioned two trailers in record time. All was ready for Sunday's action.

When undertaking the fence judge briefing in May, I realised that I repeated myself sixteen times (not to the same person). I took the decision to re-establish a group briefing. How nice it was to see everyone even though there was little time to chat and catch up.

The day got off to a good start, on time, although the first horse was reluctant to leave the start box and be a trail blazer. The first class is always a bit chaotic. It was necessary, because of time constraints, to mix individuals and pairs. The incidents of refusals, rider tumbles and general mayhem are always higher at the lower heights, where the lack of experience, horse and/or rider, is evident, but that is why we are there.

As we moved through the classes, we established a better rhythm and horses flowed out of the start box and around the course with fewer hitches.

I was reprimanded (nicely) by XC control for not factoring-in breaks between classes and allowing him time to do his fence judge radio checks or for fence 6 to move position. I apologise for this oversight.

All that said, with metronomic starter, Simon, and the excellent XC stewards, we finished the day five minutes ahead of schedule and still with plenty of daylight.

The medics were only required to check riders who had innocuous falls, before they were able to proceed, and the vet was untroubled all day. That is how we like it.

Sandra and her scoring team were on top form and results appeared rapidly. Very few queries were raised during the day, which helps. One competitor asked why he had been eliminated. Fences 4 and 12 were alongside each other, but were to be jumped in opposite directions. Thanks to fence judge notes, it transpired that instead of jumping fence 4 he had mistakenly jumped 12 in the wrong direction, which gave everyone a surprise.

A team swept in from the Cross Country and efficiently packed up, in record time, 45 minutes after the last horse had started. We were all done and dusted by 4.30pm and there was hardly a sign we were ever there.

<u>Dressage & Riding Test Qualifiers, New Park, Brockenhurst – Sunday 3rd July</u>

She had an outstanding day despite the heat, flying the BVRC flag, winning one class on each pony. Snoop was first in the Prelim Riding Test (P12), a clear 9 marks ahead of the 2nd placed rider, with Bunnie 5th. Then Bunnie won Prelim 7, over 5 marks ahead of the field, with Snoopy 4th. Sadly, with Tony recovering from an operation and a lot of diesel needed to get to Lincoln, Frances had to withdraw from the Championships. BVRC Be Fair (Competition) & Caballine (Helpers)

Be Fair points are awarded to the 6 highest placed BV members in every competition regardless of their overall places (they may be 10th in the class but 2nd best BV member). Riders are only eligible for points on one horse on any particular day.

Members who compete in teams on behalf of the BVRC will receive three points per day.

The Caballine Trophy points are awarded on a point for each hour or part hour worked at a show or setting up the day before a show. Committee members who organise the events only get points on this basis and not for other committee duties. Even so, the top places do seem to be filled by them. A rose bowl is awarded to the highest placed non-committee member.

In addition to the trophies, rosettes are presented to the top ten places in each competition. Each Trophy winner is awarded free membership for the following year.
